Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I get information about the Club?

Answer: We have three ways to get information about the club and current events. We publish a quarterly newsletter for current members, information is available at the club via the bulletin board and the club has its own web site www.rrmgc.org.

Q: When and how do I renew or become a new member?

Answer: Memberships are done annually, typically from Oct 1st to November 15th. Our "final" membership closes Dec 15th. After Dec 15th we are charged addition fee's to reinstate each player that was a member the prior year. New players can be added at any time, but get the most value from their membership by joining after Oct 1st. Application form are available at the club or online from our web site.

Q: How is my annual membership fee's used by the club?

Your annual membership fees are used to pay for your SCGA membership first. The remaining money is used to run the club, which includes costs of newsletters, additions to tournament prize funds, the christmas party, the handicap computer in the pro shop, etc.

Q: When are the tournaments and what do they cost?

All the home tournaments are generally on the third Sunday of the month. We generally have 4 to 6 away tournaments every year. This year we are hosting 5 Saturday tournaments at Victoria Lakes, the new nine hole course. We post the schedule for the year every January both in the newsletter and web site. The cost is based on the fees for 18 holes plus the prize fund. This year the cost is \$50 for the Vineyard Course and \$57 for Victoria Lakes. Away tournaments vary greatly depending on the location.

Q: How do I enter a tournament?

Tournament applications are in the newsletter, at the pro shop and on the website . On the web site we have forms you can print, fill out and mail plus an electronic form you can fill out and send directly to the tournament director.

Q: What do you get for the monthly Tournaments prize fund?

The prize fund is paid in script good for merchandise in the proshop. You can also use this script for golf carts and range balls. The script is only good at the club and is set up this way as part of an ongoing business relationship between the club and the course. The course does not charge us tournament rates (in fact we get resident rates) and does not require us to use carts. Both the course and the club benefit from the current setup.

Q: Are there club meetings and who runs the club?

The club is run by a board of directors that is elected by vote every October. The board is voluntary and not paid for their service. The board meets the second Thursday of each month at 7 pm at the club. Any member or guest is welcome to attend the monthly meeting.
